Historical context

This song can be found in the Cancionero de Palacio compiled between c.1474 and c.1505.

Translation

A los baños del amor sola me iré y en ellos me bañaré.

Porque sane de este mal que me causa desventura, qu'es un dolor tan mortal que destruye mi figura.

A los baños de tristura sola me iré y en ellos me bañaré. To the fountain of love I shall go alone to bathe in its waters.

I would be purged of this ill that brings me misfortune, for such is the pain that it ruins my features.

To the fountain of sadness I shall go alone to bathe in its waters.

The lyrics of this villancico have a definite connection with another song written by Juan Vásquez called Con que la lavaré in which a woman is lamenting for her lover and now finds herself alone. She asks the question 'With what shall I wash the flower of my face?' and decides that nothing can purge her from her feeling of desolation and pain. It is not clear what has brought the lady in this song to such a misfortune, although it would not be too fanciful to suppose that a lover who has deserted her is responsible for the pain she now feels.

Performance directions

There are various possibilities for the performance of this song. (The numbers refer to the line of music played).

Four performers:	1 sop/alto voice, 2 omit 3 bass recorder, 4 vihuela, 5 viol
Five performers:	1 sop/alto voice, 2 omit 3 tenor/bass voice, 4 vihuela, 5 viol 1 sop/alto voice, 2 bass recorder, 3 tenor/bass voice, 4 vihuela, 5 viol

Suggested tempo: minim = 52

To enable the music to be played by a greater diversity of instruments, I have added a transposed part for guitar which would need to have a capo placed on the third fret and the third string tuned down a semitone to F[#]. A cello can be substituted for the viol, a clarinet for the recorder and a lute for the vihuela.
